organization, Read to a Child and Super Bowl Champion Malcolm Mitchell's Share the Magic Foundation -- are teaming up to raise awareness of the literacy crisis in the US, to introduce book ownership to young readers and to improve literacy rates and reading

proficiency through innovative youth mentoring and literacy programming; AND

Gala' in Boston and Share the Magic Foundation will open registration for READBowl, a national reading challenge providing teachers with free resources to motivate students to
